Help Seniors Beat the Holiday Blues

While the holiday season is a festive time for many, it can cause depression for seniors who've lost loved ones or are having health or financial problems.

The society offers seniors some tips on how to avoid feeling blue during the holidays:

Get out and about. Ask family and friends for help traveling to parties and events or invite family and friends to your home.

Volunteer. Helping others can be a great mood lifter. Contact local schools, churches, synagogues and mosques to find out about volunteer opportunities.

Don't drink too much alcohol, which can lower your spirits.

Accept and express your feelings. There's nothing wrong with not feeling happy during the holidays -- many people feel the same way. Talking about your feelings can help you understand why you feel the way you do.

Recognize the signs of depression, which include: sadness that won't lift; loss of interest or pleasure; changes in appetite and weight; sleeping much more than normal; crying often; feeling restless or tired all the time; feeling worthless, helpless or guilty; slowed thinking; thoughts of death or suicide.

If you notice that an older loved one seems depressed, lend a hand by offering to help them with shopping, transportation and preparations for get-togethers in their homes, the society advises. Encourage your loved one to talk about how he or she is feeling and acknowledge their difficult feelings.

You should also encourage your loved one to talk to a health-care provider. Many older people don't realize when they're depressed. If you believe an older loved one is depressed, tell them depression is a medical illness that can be treated and managed.

Have you had your flu immunization yet? Adults over 65 years of age are one of the highest risk groups for influenza disease, complications and death. Every year in the U.S. 3,000-48,000 people die from influenza, and over 200,000 are hospitalized. Most are elderly or very young. Older adults have weaker immune systems, and even though they get the flu vaccine, they may still get the disease, although usually not as severely. Flu vaccine is easily available for those with insurance at clinics, worksites and pharmacies. Public Health-Madison and Dane County offers free flu vaccine to people without health insurance. Medigap Helpline

Known as Medigap, supplemental insurance policies cover expenses not paid for by Medicare. It is important to shop around for a Medigap policy. Under Wisconsin law all Medigap policies provide certain basic benefits, but many plans offer various optional benefits as well. 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
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

Ask the Nurse!



Do you have questions about health information? In this column, nurses from the **UW-Madison School of Nursing** will answer common health and wellness questions and help us figure out FACT from FICTION.

I've got a small cut on my hand. Should I rinse it out with hydrogen peroxide?

FACT:

No! Although many of us grew up using hydrogen peroxide to "clean out" cuts, we now know that this is not a good idea! In fact, it turns out that rinsing an open wound with hydrogen peroxide (or rubbing alcohol) can actually damage the skin around the cut and make the wound heal even more slowly. Here are some steps to follow if you get a small cut or scrape:

Stop the bleeding. Minor cuts and scrapes usually stop bleeding on their own. If they don't, apply gentle pressure with a clean cloth or bandage.

Clean the wound. Rinse out the cut with clear water. Do not use irritating soap, iodine, alcohol, or hydrogen peroxide -- fresh, clean water is enough. You can use soap to clean the area *around* the cut.

Apply an antibiotic. After you clean the wound, apply a thin layer of an antibiotic cream or ointment such as Neosporin or Polysporin to help keep the surface moist. Antibiotic products don't make the wound heal faster, but they can discourage infection and help your body's natural healing process.

Cover the wound. Bandages can help keep the wound clean and keep harmful bacteria out.


Change the bandage regularly. Change the bandage at least once a day, or whenever it becomes wet or dirty.

Get stitches for deep wounds. A wound that is more than 1/4-inch deep or is jagged-edged usually requires stitches. Band-Aids or butterfly tape may hold a small cut together, but if you can't easily close the wound, see your doctor as soon as possible.
